In fruitful cooperation with Austrian year-round gardener **DI Wolfgang Palme** and his City Farm Augarten, a comprehensive reference work for winter gardening has been created in recent years.

His valuable experience in four-season cultivation and our expertise in biodynamic breeding complement each other perfectly.

As a general rule, a decisive factor for successful winter cultivation is the right **timing** for sowing and planting. Some crops remain in the beds all year round and are harvested over the winter, while others can be sown late and harvested after a few weeks. Depending on requirements, there are two groups: Delicate vegetables such as lettuce, herbs, radishes, and kohlrabi need protection from moisture to prevent fungal infestation and rot — for example, through cold frames, raised bed covers, or cold greenhouses. Classic winter vegetables such as spinach, various cabbage varieties, root vegetables, onions, and chicory are more robust. They can withstand cold, moisture, and darkness even without protection and provide a fresh harvest in the middle of winter.

Attention home gardeners! Your garden doesn't need a winter break!

Winter in the home garden – this is the lost season in the vegetable garden, because we simply do not expect anything from it. Winter is understandably not the main growing season, but it is harvest time. And we seem to have forgotten that.

After 15 years of intensive applied research and practical gardening education at **City Farm Augarten**, DI Wolfgang Palme and his team can say that many types of vegetables are much more frost-resistant than is officially acknowledged.

The following should be noted for a successful winter harvest:

If the crop freezes during cold winter nights, the leaf rosettes lie flat and glassy on the ground, but after the leaves slowly thaw (when the sun shines during the day), they are fresh and undamaged again. However, frozen leaves must not be touched or harvested. This is because

ice crystals destroy the delicate leaf tissue, resulting in black discolouration and »mushiness«.

In general, it is important to ensure adequate ventilation in protected areas to prevent fungal infections. Ventilation and moderate watering are much more important in winter than heating!

ReinSaat and the garden education association City Farm Augarten make year-round gardening child's play. Especially in the big city – but not only there – it is essential to teach young and old alike the joy of gardening, practical knowledge about soil and plants, and the enjoyment of a variety of vegetables. For our children in particular, this is preparation for life that cannot be taught in the classroom. In the diversity garden of City Farm Augarten, this happens every day with a great deal of enthusiasm and commitment – in summer and winter alike.
